ABSTRACT

Science communication is too often treated as decorative trim – a frill to be added onto the edges of an already overburdened researcher's schedule, rarely incentivised, celebrated, or rewarded.

Drawing on 25 years of experience as a science communicator, trainer, researcher, and facilitator, Robert Inglis makes the case that this framing is backwards. Far from a peripheral flourish at the end of a lengthy research process, integrating communications into scientific processes is exactly what keeps science meaningful, visible, impactful and accountable.

More than this, co-creating communications with communities most affected by research can build relationships, develop skills, and open space for scientists to reflect deeply on the societal value of their work. This shapes not only how science is shared, but also how science transforms society, and is itself transformed in the process.
